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113 **SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA,**
 114 That Sections 1-1 and 1-9A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and they
 115 are hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
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Chapter 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article I. Adoption of Code

1-1 Code adopted.

The Code of the Town of La Plata, 1998 Edition, as compiled, codified, edited and published by Book Publishing Company, Seattle, Washington, including supplement dated September, 1998 (covering ordinances through Ordinance 98-4), a copy of which is on file in the office of the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) and incorporated by reference, is adopted as the Code of laws of general application and continuing force in the town, from and after January 1, 1999. In addition to those matters published in the Code, all ordinances adopted after July 28, 1998, and before January 1, 1999, amending the Code of the Town of La Plata (1988, as amended) but not printed in this 1998 Code also are adopted as part of this Code and shall be codified and published in the next supplement to this Code. Until these ordinances are recodified in the next supplement to this Code, they shall be construed and interpreted in conjunction with their corresponding provisions in this Code. The Charter of the Town of La Plata as contained in said "Code of the Town of La Plata (1998) Edition," by Book Publishing Company, Seattle, Washington, is adopted as evidence of the Charter of the Town on and after January 1, 1999.

1-9 Definitions, word usage and construal of provisions.

A. In the construction of this Code and of all ordinances, the following general definitions shall be observed, unless such definitions would be inconsistent with the manifest intent of the Town Council.

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CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER -- The Town Manager or the Mayor, if a Town Manager has not been appointed.*

((CLERK-TREASURER -- The Clerk-Treasurer of the town, as appointed pursuant to § C8-1 of the Charter.))

TOWN -- The Town of La Plata, in the County of Charles and State of Maryland, except as otherwise provided.

TOWN CLERK – THE TOWN CLERK OF THE TOWN; CLERK TO THE COUNCIL.

TOWN TREASURER – THE TOWN TREASURER OF THE TOWN, AS APPOINTED PURSUANT TO § C8-1 OF THE CHARTER.

193 **9-7 Application fee.**
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195 Except where another amount is specified by law, any appeal from an administrative decision to the
196 Board of Appeals shall be subject to and accompanied by an application fee of one hundred fifty
197 dollars (\$150.). One-half of any application fee paid pursuant to this section shall be refunded if, at
198 the conclusion of the proceedings before the Board of Appeals and any subsequent judicial appellate
199 proceedings related to the proceedings before the Board, the relief sought before the Board is

200 granted, and provided that the appellant has made application to the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer

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210 **13-2 Special meetings.**

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212 Special meetings shall be called by the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) upon the written request of the
213 Mayor, the Chief Executive Officer or a majority of the members of the Council. Whenever a special
214 meeting shall be called, a summons or a notice, in writing, signed by the Mayor or TOWN Clerk ((-
215 Treasurer)), shall be served upon each member of the Council, either in person or by notice left at his
216 place of residence, stating the date and hour of the meeting and the purpose for which such meeting is
217 called.

218
219 **13-3 Agenda.**

220
221 All reports, communications, ordinances, resolutions, contract documents or other matters to be
222 submitted to the Council shall be delivered to the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)), whereupon the
223 TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) shall immediately arrange a list of such matters according to the order of
224 business and furnish each member of the Council with a copy of the same prior to the Council
225 meeting and as far in advance of the meetings as time for preparation will permit.

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227 **13-5 Roll call.**

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229 Before proceeding with the business of the Council, the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) or his deputy
230 shall call the roll of the members, and the names of those present shall be entered in the minutes. The
231 roll call may be silent or with voice, at the discretion of the Mayor.

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233 **13-7 Order of business.**

234
235 All meetings of the Council shall be open to the public. Promptly at the hour set on the day of each
236 regular meeting, the members of the Council, the TOWN Clerk((-Treasurer)), the City Attorney and
237 the Chief Executive Officer shall take their regular stations in the Council Chambers, and the business
238 of the Council shall be taken up for consideration and disposition in the following order:

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241 **13-8 Reading minutes.**

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Unless a reading of the minutes of a Council meeting is requested by a member of the Council, such minutes may be approved without reading if the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) has previously furnished each member with a copy thereof.

13-9 Rules of debate.

G. Synopsis of debate; when entered in minutes. The TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) may be directed by the presiding officer, with consent of the Council, to enter in the minutes a synopsis of the discussion on any question coming regularly before the Council.

13-10 Addressing Council generally.

B. Oral communications. Taxpayers or residents of the town and their authorized legal representatives may address the Council by oral communications on any matter concerning the town business or any matter over which the Council has control; provided, however, that preference shall be given to those persons who may have notified the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) in advance of their desire to speak in order that the same may appear on the agenda of the Council.

13-20 Filing reports and resolutions.

All reports and resolutions shall be filed with the TOWN Clerk ((-Treasurer)) and entered in the minutes.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 20-5C.(4) of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 20 ETHICS

20-5 Financial disclosure.

C. The following officials and employees are required to file:

(4) The ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 75-2G. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 75 BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

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Article I. Building Code

75-2 Modifications.

The International Building Code 2000, as adopted by § 75-1, is modified as set forth below:

G. In the last line of Section 105.3.1 on page 4, delete “issue” and substitute “authorize the issuance of;” and in that same line, immediately after “practicable” insert “by the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer of the Town.”

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 78-4A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 78 BUILDING NUMBERING AND STREET NAMING

78-4 Assignment of building numbers by town.

A. The Chief Executive Officer or the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer, in his absence, is hereby authorized and empowered to assign or reassign numbers to properties and principal buildings within the corporate limits of the Town of La Plata.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Sections 98-2B. and 98-10 of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and they are hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 98 FARMERS MARKET

98-2 Market Master.

B. The Market Master shall review the application of any seller offering articles for sale, issue permits and collect fees therefor, assign spaces to sellers, maintain the market’s cleanliness, enforce the market regulations under the direction of the Farmers Market Commission and establish a system of bookkeeping for the market in conjunction with the system used by the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer of the Town of La Plata.

98-10 Market Fund.

There is hereby created a Market Fund. All fees and other revenue derived from the farmers market shall be accounted for and immediately turned over to the Town ((Clerk-)) Treasurer and deposited in the Market Fund. Expenses for the farmers market shall be approved by the Farmers Market Commission and paid by the Town ((Clerk-)) Treasurer from the Market Fund.

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SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 111-4A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 111 GAS FRANCHISE

111-4 Acceptance and duration of franchise.

A. As evidence of the acceptance of this franchise by Washington Gas Light Company upon the terms and conditions set forth in this chapter and of its agreement to abide by and perform each and all of the terms and conditions set forth in this chapter, Washington Gas Light Company shall cause to be indicated its acceptance thereof in its corporate name signed by its president or a vice-president, its corporate seal to be thereto affixed and attested by its secretary or an assistant secretary, and shall file such acceptance with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer. The date of acceptance shall be the date of filing of the acceptance with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 117-12 of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

**Chapter 117 HEALTH AND SANITATION
Article III. Weed Control**

117-12 Collection of removal charges.

When the town has effected the removal of such dangerous weeds, grass or other vegetation or has paid for their removal, the actual cost thereof, plus ten dollars (\$10.) per hour, plus accrued interest at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum from the date of the completion of the work, if not paid by such owner prior thereto, shall be charged to the owner of such property on the next regular tax bill forwarded to such owner by the town, and said charge shall be due and payable by said owner at the time of payment of such bill. Until the expenses are paid by the owner, they shall constitute a lien upon the property, and the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer shall add such costs to the tax bill for the year, and they shall be collected in the same manner as other town taxes.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Sections 132-16B. and 132-16C. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and they are hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 132 LITTERING

132-16 Performance of work by town.

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B. Action upon noncompliance. Upon the failure, neglect or refusal of any owner or agent so notified to properly dispose of litter dangerous to the public health, safety or welfare within fourteen (14) days after receipt of written notice provided for in Subsection A above or within fourteen (14) days after the date of such notice in the event that the same is returned to the Town Post Office Department because of its inability to make delivery thereof, provided that the same was properly addressed to the last known address of such owner or agent, the Chief Executive Officer and the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer are hereby authorized and empowered to pay for the disposing of such litter or to order its disposal by the town.

C. Charge included in tax bill. When the town has effected the removal of such dangerous litter or has paid for its removal, the actual cost thereof, plus ten dollars (\$10.) per hour, plus accrued interest at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum from the date of the completion of the work, if not paid by such owner prior thereto, shall be charged to the owner of such property on the next regular tax bill forwarded to such owner by the town, and said charge shall be due and payable by said owner at the time of payment of such bill. Until the expenses are paid by the owner, they shall constitute a lien upon the property, and the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer shall add such costs to the tax bill for the year, and they shall be collected in the same manner as other town taxes

SECTION 12. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 143-2A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 143 PAWNBROKERS, SECONDHAND DEALERS AND SWAP SHOPS
143-2 Application for license; investigation.

A. Application for a pawnbroker’s, swap shop’s or secondhand dealer’s license shall be made to the Town ((Clerk-)) Treasurer and shall state thereon the name of the applicant, the place of business and the number of employees intended to be engaged.

SECTION 13. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Sections 149-5, 149-7, 149-8, 149-9C., 149-10, and 149-11 of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and they are hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 149 PEDDLING, SOLICITING AND STREET VENDING
149-5 Application for license.

An applicant for a license shall file with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer a signed application giving the following information:

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149-7 Issuance of license.

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411 Upon certification for issuance of the license by the Chief Executive Officer and upon receipt of a
412 peddler's license fee as set forth in Chapter 101, Fees, the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer is authorized
413 to issue such license.

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415 **149-8 Appeals.**

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417 An appeal from the action of the Chief Executive Officer in failing to approve a certification for
418 issuance of a peddler's license may be taken to the Town Council, who shall thereafter affirm the
419 action of the Chief Executive Officer or overrule it and direct the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer to issue
420 the license. The Town Council shall render its decision within sixty (60) days of hearing such appeal.

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422 **149-9 Term and display of license.**

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424 C. The licenses shall remain the property of the town and shall be surrendered to the ((Clerk-))
425 TOWN Treasurer upon expiration, suspension or revocation.

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427 **149-10 Renewal of license.**

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429 The holder of any expiring license under this chapter desiring a new license to be effective on the
430 expiration of the existing license shall not less than thirty (30) nor more than sixty (60) days before
431 the expiration of the existing license, file a written application for renewal with the TOWN ((Clerk-
432 Treasurer)), giving the information set forth in § 149-5. There must be filed with the application a
433 renewal fee as set forth in Chapter 101, Fees.

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435 **149-11 Denial, revocation or suspension of license.**

436
437 The ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer may refuse to issue to renew a license or may revoke or suspend any
438 license issued under this chapter if he finds that the applicant or licensee has willfully withheld or
439 falsified any information required for a license or has been convicted of any of the crimes described in
440 § 149-5. The ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer may suspend for a period up to ninety (90) days or revoke
441 or refuse to renew any license upon a finding that the licensee, while peddling or soliciting and in
442 connection therewith, has engaged in fraud or willful misrepresentation, has violated any provision of
443 this chapter, has committed an unlawful act or has refused to leave the premises immediately when
444 requested by the owner or occupant thereof to do so. Any revocation, suspension or failure to renew
445 shall be by written notice to the licensee, delivered personally or sent by certified mail to the licensee's
446 local address listed in his application. The notice shall contain a statement of the reason for the action
447 taken.

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449 **SECTION 14. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF**
450 **LA PLATA,** That Section 173-41A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be
451 and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

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Chapter 173 SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT
Article VI. Grading and Sediment Control

173-41 Other security.

A. In lieu of a performance collateral bond, the applicant may file with the Department of Inspections, to be deposited with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer, a cash deposit or certified check in the amount which would be required by a performance bond, provided that every such deposit shall be subject to the conditions of § 173-40 hereof. Upon satisfactory completion of the work specified in the grading permit, any unused portion of a cash deposit shall be refunded to the applicant.

SECTION 15. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Sections 176-5 and 176-7A. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and they are hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 176 TAXICABS
Article II. Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity

176-5 Application for certificate.

An application for a certificate shall be filed with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer upon forms provided by the town, and each application shall be verified under oath and shall furnish the following information:

* * *

176-7 Issuance of certificate.

A. If the Town Council finds that further taxicab service in the town is required by the public convenience and necessity and that the applicant is fit, willing and able to perform such public transportation and to conform to the provisions of this chapter and the rules promulgated by the Town Council, then the Council shall order the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer to issue a certificate stating the name and address of the applicant, the number of vehicles authorized under the certificate and the date of issuance; otherwise, the application shall be denied.

SECTION 16. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LA PLATA, That Section 181-14D. of the Code of the Town of La Plata (1998 Edition as amended) be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Chapter 181 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC
Article III. Rules of the Road

181-14 Vision obstructions.

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D. Whenever it is necessary for the town to provide for the removal or elimination of any type of obstruction referred to herein pursuant to the procedures prescribed above, a certified statement of the cost to the town of such removal or elimination, together with proof of service of the notice above described, shall be filed with the ((Clerk-)) TOWN Treasurer. The cost of such removal, plus ten dollars (\$10.) per hour, together with the cost of publication, shall therefrom and thereafter constitute a charge against the owner of said property and may be recovered by the Town Council by appropriate legal action.

SECTION 17. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or any other application of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end, all the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 18. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Ordinance shall become effective at such time as Resolution 07-3, Charter Amendment – Separation of Title of Clerk-Treasurer to Town Clerk and Town Treasurer, is adopted and takes effect, and if Resolution 07-3 is not adopted or does not take effect this Ordinance shall be null and void and of no further effect without further action of the Council of the Town of La Plata.
