11 certain paid holidays shall be observed by all employees of the Town, except sworn Police
12 Department employees who are governed by the Holiday Leave Policy of that department;

15 **LA PLATA** that the following holiday schedule be adopted for FY 2005-2006, and be designated as
16 regular holidays on which the La Plata Town Hall will be closed:

28 *Memorial Day (observed) May 29, 2006
