6 Town of La Plata for FY 2006-2007; and all matters relating to said schedule of holidays.

10 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Personnel Rules and Regulations of the Town of La Plata,
11 certain paid holidays shall be observed by all employees of the Town, except sworn Police
12 Department employees who are governed by the Holiday Leave Policy of that department;

14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF**
15 **LA PLATA** that the following holiday schedule be adopted for FY 2006-2007, and be designated as
16 regular holidays on which the La Plata Town Hall will be closed:

26	*Presidents Day	February 19, 2007

28	*Memorial Day (observed)	May 28, 2007

31 Day (June 14), Election Days, and traditional Memorial Day (May 30).
